

Insurance changes for Massachusetts families of children with disabilities

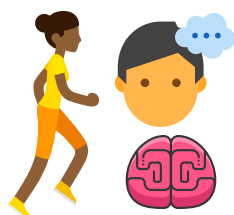
These changes make it easier to get health care services during the coronavirus pandemic.

Phone and video appointments with your doctor ("telehealth").

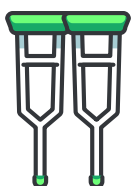
These are covered by MassHealth and private insurance. Some private insurance companies are waiving co-pays.

Phone and video appointments for specialty therapy too.

This includes speech therapy, physical, and occupational therapy, ABA, and mental health services.

90 days of medical equipment

MassHealth and many private health insurance plans will now cover a 90-day supply of medical equipment like breathing monitors and diabetes care equipment.



4

Easier access to prescriptions

MassHealth and many private insurance plans cover a 90-day supply of many medicines and allow early refills.



5

Health insurance enrollment and coverage

MassHealth and all private insurance plans cover the cost of COVID-19 testing. You cannot lose your insurance because you get tested, become infected, or seek treatment. If you do not have insurance, you can apply through the Massachusetts Health Connector until May 25, 2020.
